- 7. A review and inspection of the district found the following:

The ditch crossing north of Cross Plains at County Trunk Hwy. P has three large culverts. Only one has flow going through it. Brush is growing on both sides of the ditch west of CTH P.

At the next road north of Enchanted Valley Road (dead end drive), the land to the north is wooded. There is brush full length of the ditch in both corridors. The Drainage Board has been told that the landowner will clear the drainage corridor of trees and brush. They did not.

The bridge crossing on the Ziegler's land needs to be replaced. Preliminary estimate is roughly \$25,000.

8. It is the Drainage Board's practice to review the condition of the district on an annual basis and as requested by district residents. All work within the district on district facilities is approved and performed pursuant to Chapter 88 of the Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter ACTP 48 of the Wisconsin Administrative code.
