ANNUAL REPORT

As of August 31, 2017

The Dane County Drainage Board submits the following annual report for the above identified drainage district for the twelve (12) month period ending August 31, 2017.

1. No work done in the district.
2. A review and inspection of the district found the following:

The main channel north of the railroad tracks in the Village of DeForest to Yahara Road is full of grass. The brush is now about 20 feet tall where the trees were logged and debris was removed several years ago from the main ditch banks.

Brush coming in along the main ditch north of the Yahara Road Bridge. Good flow in the main ditch at Yahara Road. There was good flow at the Dog Park. The brush is getting much bigger. At the field road crossing on the Manthe property, flow was good. No brush or trees were growing on the ditch.

An inspection of flow from the Village of DeForest industrial park in July found that there may be significant damage to the Lamm and Quamme properties in the district. The annual inspection found yellow corn on the Quamme property which may result in a significant yield loss. The annual inspection found that three outlets from the industrial park were dumping water onto the Lamm property and into the drainage district.
